I-39/90 Interchanges with I-43 and WIS 81, Beloit

From the I-39/90 Project Communications Manager:

Nightly lane closures on I-39/90 northbound and southbound near the Beloit interchange.

- 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday through Thursday nights (October 18 - 21)
- Plan ahead for slowdowns in this area.

I-43/WIS 81 ramp **CLOSED** to I-39/90 northbound in Beloit.

- 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Tuesday night (Oct. 19)
- Alternate routes are required such as Hart Road to Shopiere Road to travel north on I-39/90.
- Crews will complete permanent pavement markings along the ramp.

Low Income Household Water Assistance Program

The City of Beloit is now an approved vendor on the Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP). LIHWAP is a temporary emergency program that will help low-income households and families afford water and wastewater services during the Coronavirus pandemic. Residents apply directly to the program through a joint application for the Low Income Household Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) and the Emergency Rental Assistance Program by visiting

<https://energybenefit.wi.gov/OnlineApps/OnlineApp/Default#!> or calling 800-506-5596.

- Households with completed, approved LIHEAP applications will be automatically enrolled in LIHWAP if they have a water and/or wastewater burden.
- While LIHWAP will only provide assistance for customers who have a direct payment relationship with a water supplier, renters whose utility payments are included in their rent are eligible for assistance with their heating and electric services through the state's LIHEAP program. Renters whose incomes were impacted by COVID-19 can also receive assistance with water service and utility payments that are included in their rent through Wisconsin's Emergency Rental Assistance Program.
- Payments under the program will be sent directly to the city to be applied to the
