Calling all dog owners!

The deadline to get your 2022 dog license is Thursday, March 31, 2022. On January 1 of each year, you are required to license all dogs aged 5 months or over. You are required to provide proof of their current rabies vaccination, which also shows the tag numbers and the expiration dates.

If the dog is licensed after April 1, a \$10 late fee will be imposed unless you are a new resident of the City or if the dog is newly acquired. Noncompliance may result in the issuance of a citation.

Spring Election Update

The clerk-treasurer's office has mailed the



first batch of absentee ballots to individuals who requested the ballots for April 5, 2022, election by mail. Ballots should be returned using the United States Postal Service or inperson at City Hall between 8 am and 5 pm Mondays-Fridays. Ballots must be received by 8 pm April 5, 2022, to be counted.

Do not place absentee ballots in either utility bill dropbox. Ballots placed in the drop boxes may not be counted.

Still need to register to vote? You can register in person at City Hall or at your polling place on Election Day. Visit My Vote to find your polling place; your polling place may have changed due to redistricting.
