Water Pollution Control Facility Ground Breaking - June 13, 2022

The City of Beloit is holding a ground breaking ceremony to celebrate the start of construction on the Water Pollution Control Facility's upgrade project at 11 a.m. Monday, June 13, at 555 Willowbrook Road.

The Water Pollution Control Facility is over 30 years old with aging equipment that has exceeded its useful life. As part of the upgrades, the project includes a new biosolids drying building, equipment, and storage silo, as well as ultra-violet disinfection equipment and other equipment upgrades and facility improvements.

The project is expected to be completed in October 2024.

Walmart Bus Stop to Temporarily Close

Due to the bus stop being closed, alternate bus stops will have to be used. The bus stop on Branigan Rd next to McDonald's will be an alternative bus stop to be used before the bus continues on its way to Piggly Wiggly. The stop on Cranston Rd next to First National Bank is the alternate bus stop to be used after Piggly Wiggly and before Walmart as the bus heads downtown to Transfer Center. We will work with the pavement crew to get the bus stop opened up as soon as possible so we can return to normal routing.

Rock County Raised to CDC's "High" Level of COVID-19 Activity

Rock County, WI - Increased COVID-19 hospitalizations have moved Rock County from "medium" to "high" COVID-19 community levels, according to criteria set forth by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

The CDC determines the COVID-19 Community Level based on a combination of metrics that include new cases and new COVID-19 hospital admissions. It evaluates new COVID-19 admissions per 100,000 population in the past 7 days, the percent of staffed inpatient beds occupied by COVID-19 patients, and the total new COVID-19 cases per 100,000 population in the past 7 days to determine the COVID-19 community level. New COVID-19 admissions and the percent of staffed inpatient beds occupied represent the current potential for strain on the health system. Data on new cases acts as an early warning indicator of potential increases in health system strain in the event of a COVID-19 surge.

Please mask and maintain 6ft of social distance whenever possible.
