City of Beloit Reminds Community of Political Sign Requirements

Residents wishing to display their support for political candidates are reminded of the city's sign ordinance, which allows the display of political signs while protecting community aesthetics and promoting traffic safety. If you're planning on displaying a political sign, please follow these requirements:

- Display the sign on private property (with permission if not your own property)
- No larger than 32 square feet
- Place the sign at least 10 feet back from property lines
- Do not display in the public right-of-way or on other government property, including (but not limited to)
 - o Parks
 - o Street Terraces
 - o Medians
 - o Vacant Lots



City of Beloit Supporting Main Street **Bounceback Grants**

The City of Beloit is providing letters of support to local businesses seeking the State of Wisconsin's Main Street Bounceback Grant. The deadline to apply for the grant is December 31, 2022.

The program provides \$10,000 grants to businesses moving into vacant commercial spaces of at least 400 square feet. The grant funds can be used for lease or mortgage payments, operating expenses, building repairs, tenant improvements and other qualified expenses. Funds cannot be used on storage spaces or for residential uses.
