# ALCOHOL BEVERAGE LICENSE CONTROL & ADVISORY COMMITTEE:

Recommends action to City Council regarding liquor licensing. Meets on 2nd Tuesday of the month at 4:00 p.m. in the Forum, City Hall. Members must be over legal drinking age. Term: 3 years

## APPOINTMENT REVIEW COMMITTEE:

Recommends to City Council nominees for vacancies on municipal committees. Meets monthly at 4:30 p.m. on 2nd Monday in City Hall Forum. Term: 3 years

#### **BOARD OF APPEALS**:

Hears and acts upon variances to the zoning and floodplain ordinances and appeals of administrative decisions regarding enforcement of the zoning and floodplain ordinances.

Meets monthly, starting at a time no sooner than 6:30 p.m., and no later than 8:00 p.m. on the 2nd Tuesday of each month in the Forum, City Hall.

# **BOARD OF ETHICS:**

Hears charges against the conduct of public employees and recommends local Ethics Code amendments. Meets on notice except annual meeting 3rd Thursday in January. Term: 3 years

#### **BOARD OF REVIEW:**

Sets tax assessment roll and hears property valuation disputes.

Meets annually at any time during the 30-day period beginning on the 2nd Monday in May in the City Hall Forum. Term: 5 years

# **BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT (DOWNTOWN BELOIT ASSOCIATION):**

Implements the operating plan for the development, redevelopment, maintenance, operation, and promotion of the downtown business improvement district. The annual plan and changes are submitted to the City Council for approval.

Meets monthly at 8:30 a.m. on the 4th Thursday at 557 E. Grand Ave. Term: 3 years

# COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY:

Plans and implements economic redevelopment and housing initiatives; oversees the operations of the public housing office.

Meets monthly at 4:30 p.m. on 4th Wednesday at Beloit City Hall Forum, 100 State Street. Term: 4 years

# EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES COMMISSION:

Created to improve the quality of life by the elimination of racism in the Beloit community. Encourages compliance with municipal, state and federal laws providing for equal opportunities in housing, employment public accommodations and education. Studies and recommends solutions to local social, economic, and cultural problems to ensure equal opportunities for all people residing or working in the City of Beloit. Meets on the 3rd Wednesday of each even-numbered month. Term: 3 years

## LANDMARKS COMMISSION:

Designates historic landmarks and regulates construction in historic districts. Members: 1 City Councilor; 1 representative from the Bluff St. or Merrill St. Historic District; 1 rep from the College Park/Near East Side Historic District; 1 rep each with expertise in construction, real estate and history/archeology and 2 citizens at large. Meets monthly as needed on the 3rd Tuesday at 7:00 p.m. in the Forum. Term: 3 years

## MUNICIPAL GOLF COMMITTEE:

Reviews the operations, maintenance, and financing of the Municipal Golf Course and makes recommendations regarding operation of the same.

Meets on the 3rd Wednesday of the months of March through October at 7:00 a.m. Term: 3 years (1 year for youth rep.)

#### MUNICIPAL LIBRARY BOARD:

Sets library policies; monitors finances; employs staff. Meets monthly at 6:00 p.m. on 3rd Wednesday at Beloit Public Library, 605 Eclipse Blvd. Term: 3 years

## PARK, RECREATION & CONSERVATION ADVISORY COMMISSION:

Recommends action regarding parks, recreation programs and facilities use as well as local conservation issues. Meets the 2nd Wednesday of each month at 6:30 p.m. at the DPW, 2351 Springbrook Ct. Term: 3 years

#### PLAN COMMISSION:

Produces master plan regulating physical community development; recommends action on zoning, subdivision and planning.

Meets bimonthly in Forum at 7:00 p.m. on Wednesdays following Council meetings. Term: 3 years

#### POLICE AND FIRE COMMISSION:

The Police and Fire Commission consists of five residents who are responsible for hiring Police and Fire chiefs and approval of subordinate appointments. It also reviews charges against and may discipline or dismiss the Police or Fire Chief or any subordinate.

Meets monthly on 4th Monday in the Forum or other designated area.

Term: 5 years (Supplemental application necessary, please contact City Manager's Office, 364-6614.)

## TRAFFIC REVIEW COMMITTEE:

Studies traffic conditions in the City and makes recommendations to City Council on local traffic-related issues. Meets every other even month at 1:30 p.m. on 4th Monday at 2400 Springbrook Conference Room. Term: 2 years
