Public Information Meeting

A project information meeting is scheduled for Thursday, March 16th, 2023 at 2400 Springbrook Court to receive public input for a proposed project at the intersection of White Avenue and Milwaukee Road. A short presentation will be given at 5:30 p.m. followed by an open house until



6:30 p.m.

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) has been working with the City of Beloit in applying for a Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) grant to fund the reconstruction of the Milwaukee Avenue and White Avenue intersection to improve safety and reduce vehicle speeds. It is anticipated that pedestrian and bicycle accommodations will be a part of any potential contract. The current proposal includes the construction of a round-a-bout at this intersection.

A representative from the City and WisDOT will be on hand to present the information and receive public feedback.

Along with other employers in Rock County, City of Beloit representatives will be available to take applications for seasonal employment. You will be able to meet in person with employers and discuss your experience and skills.



Dog License Due by March 31

In the City of Beloit, all dogs aged 5 months or over are required to be licensed. The deadline to license without a late fee is March 31. Proof of current rabies vaccination is required.

The cost is \$20 unless the dog is spayed or neutered (proof required), then the cost is only \$10.
