#### City Council Organization Meeting

The Beloit City Council re-elected Regina Dunkin as Council President and Nancy Forbeck as Vice President during their annual organization meeting held Tuesday. Dunkin and Forbeck were elected to the position by others on the City Council. They will serve in those roles through April, 2024.

Councilors Sherry Blakeley, Forbeck and Yusuf Adama were sworn into office for their two-year terms. Adama is a newcomer to the Council, while Blakeley and Forbeck were re-elected in April.

City Councilor Clinton Anderson was honored during the regular City Council meeting for his service to the Beloit community; he did not seek re-election due to his new position as a State Representative.
