City Hall Small Parking Lot Closed May 3

The small parking lot at City Hall will be closed on May 3rd (subject to weather).

A roof top unit that is instrumental for heating and cooling the 2nd, 3rd and 4th floors at City Hall is scheduled to be replaced. The crane that



will lift the new unit into place is scheduled to arrive on May 3rd and will be placed in the small parking lot. For reasons of positioning the crane and for safety to people on the ground, the small parking lot will be closed for the entire day. Employees and the public should park in the main lot with access from Shirland Ave. All deliveries should be routed to come in from Shirland Ave.

The drop box in the circle will remain accessible.



Open Book and Board of Review Information

If you feel that your property assessment is incorrect, there is a process to follow to rectify it.

First, talk to the Assessor. Open Book is the second step in the assessment appeals process. Here, property owners have an opportunity to compare their assessed value with similar properties within the City.

The assessment roll for the year 2023 will be open for examination from May 1-10, between 9am and 3pm in the 1st floor lobby of City Hall, 100 State Street.
