### City Council Annual Organization

The Beloit City Council elected Kevin D. Leavy to serve as council president and Kevin Day to serve as council vice-president during its annual organization meeting this past Tuesday.

Leavy, Day, Markese Terrell and Marty Densch were sworn into office for their two-year terms after being elected to office on April 2nd.

Past Council President Regina Dunkin was honored for her service with a plaque Monday night. She chose to not seek re-election to another city council term.



#### Temporary Bike Lane Closure

The bike lanes on Henry Avenue between Riverside and Royce will be closed April 22 - 24 while asphalt cracks are being sealed. Flaggers will be on-site directing traffic from various intersections and driveways. Two-way traffic will be maintained.



# Public Information Meeting - Henry Avenue Project

The City of Beloit will soon start a street resurfacing project along Henry Avenue and Shopiere Road between Royce and Prairie Avenues.

The project is expected to begin Monday, April 29. There is no detour planned while traffic remains open in both directions. However, please use an alternate route if possible and use caution while traveling through the work zone. The project is expected to be completed in late June.

The community is invited to a public

information meeting about the project from 5-6pm Tuesday, April 23, at the City of Beloit Department of Public Works' Water Resources & Engineering Facility, 2400 Springbrook Court. The meeting will be hosted by City of Beloit Engineering Division staff in an open house format to address any questions or concerns of the project. There will be no formal presentation.

# Public Involvement Meeting - Proposed Improvements to WIS 81 and WIS 213/McKinley Ave. Intersection

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation will hold a Public Information Meeting from 4:30 - 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, April 24 at the Beloit Historical Society, 845 Hackett St., Beloit. The purpose of the meeting is to discuss the proposed improvements at the WIS 81 and WIS 213/McKinley Ave. intersection.

The proposed design is to reconstruct the intersection with a 4-legged 90-degree intersection at a traffic signal. This alternative reduces the total number of controlled intersections from 3 to 2, which improves safety conditions while preserving traffic operations and reducing intersection skew angles. Construction is scheduled for 2027.

#### Public Information Meeting - Turtle Creek Park Master Plan

The City of Beloit is seeking community input on the second phase of Turtle Creek Park's Master Plan, which includes demolition of the bathhouse, construction of new restrooms, installation of bike racks, signage, a kiosk, unity columns, picnic tables, grills, waste receptacles, and a bike oasis.

The Beloit City Council reserved \$1 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) finding to complete the second phase in the park's master plan. Turtle Creek Park is located at 1312 E. Grand Ave.

The public meeting is scheduled from 5-6pm on **Thursday, April 25,** at 2400 Springbrook Court.

#### NO MOW MAY

The Beloit City Council approved an ordinance change that allows for Beloit residents to participate in "No Mow May" in 2024 to help support the presence of pollinators.

In order to participate in No Mow May, the property owner must:

• Register with the City of Beloit's



- Community Development Department by May 1, 2024.
- Display a city-issued sign in the yard to notify the community that the property is participating in the program.
- Ensure grass and weeds do not grow longer than 12 inches.

Registration will open Monday, April 15, 2024. In-person registration and signs are available at the Community Development Department at 100 State Street, Beloit, WI. City Hall is open Monday through Friday 8 am to 4:30 pm.

No Mow May is a voluntary program for City residents. Individuals who do not register by May 1, 2024, will need to comply with the ordinance's standards of grass and weeds to not exceed 8 inches.

Community members encouraged the City Council to create an exemption in the city's long grasses and weeds section of the ordinance to promote this sustainability initiative. Over 250 people took a community survey on No Mow May with 73.6% in support and 26.4% against the program.

#### **Spring Terrace Tree Planting**

The City of Beloit Public Works Department is currently accepting requests from residents for terrace trees to be planted this spring. Trees will be planted on a first-come, first-served basis.

The terrace tree species selection will be determined by the city forestry supervisor while taking into account the size of the terrace, presence of utilities and exotic invasive insects. A limited supply of trees are available. Forestry will accept requests through Wednesday, May 1, 2024.
