## UPDATE #1 - Officer Involved Shooting Incident on Oak Street

June 5, 2024 - The Beloit Police Department is investigating an officer involved shooting that occurred in the City of Beloit, Wednesday, May 29.

At approximately 1:34 p.m., officers with the Beloit Police Department responded to a 911 call for a reported male running through backyards in the 800 block of Oak Street in the City of Beloit. When they arrived officers located an adult male, who had verbal contact with an officer. During that encounter the male, who has been identified as Thomas Sykes, sprinted towards the officer in an aggressive manner. The officer gave several verbal commands for the male to stop. Sykes continued his aggressive behavior. The officer fired at Sykes, missing him. Sykes was taken into custody and transported for medical clearance.

At the initial scene, investigating officers interviewed potential witnesses and obtained statements.

No officers were treated for any injuries. Involved law enforcement were wearing body cameras during the incident.

The Beloit Police is leading this investigation. This matter is still considered ongoing and further information will be released at the completion of the investigation.
