Gregory X. Ashford, age 32, of Beloit

December 26, 2024 - The City of Beloit Police Department is investigating a homicide and non-fatal shooting that occurred Thursday, December 26, in the 1200 block of Oak Street.

At approximately 7:38 pm, the Beloit Police Department responded to the area for reports of shots fired. On our arrival, officers located two victims suffering from

injuries sustained from gunfire. One of the victims, a male, has tragically succumbed to his injuries.

"Our heartfelt condolences go out to his family and loved ones during this difficult time," Police Chief Andre Sayles said.

A female victim was also injured in this incident, but thankfully, her injuries are not life-threatening, and she is expected to make a full recovery.

The City of Beloit Police Department is not identifying the victims at this time.

City of Beloit detectives are working tirelessly to piece together the events that led to this senseless act of violence. The department is actively pursuing all leads and is committed to conducting a thorough and comprehensive investigation to ensure justice is served.
