


Bicycle Compatibility of Existing Roadways






RULES OF THE ROAD

Obey Traffic Laws. Familiarize yourself with Wisconsin and Illinois traffic laws. Remember, a bicycle is a vehicle, and must obey all traffic rules and signs. Always ride with the flow of traffic.

Ride Single File. Single file is the safest way to ride. Never ride more than two abreast.

Wear a Helmet! Equip yourself with an approved helmet of the proper size and fit.

Ride as near as practical to the right side of the pavement. Always ride on the right side of the road, in the same direction as traffic.

Use hand signals. Signaling your intentions 50 feet in advance of turning or stopping is essential to let motor vehicle operators and riding companions know what you are about to do.

Equip your bicycle properly. Make sure that brakes and other parts are in good working order. When riding after dark, you must use a white light visible at least 500 feet to the front, and a red reflector visible at least 500 feet to the rear. Side reflectors and reflector pedals are also helpful.

Dress appropriately. Wear brightly colored clothing (with reflective patches at night), and carry a water-resistant jacket for protection from sudden changes in weather and temperature.

Avoid riding on rural roads at night. Rural roads are not lit up like city streets. Use extra caution any time of day, because the most severe crashes occur in rural areas where vehicles travel at faster speeds.

Maintain a "Safety First" attitude. Select routes that meet your riding abilities. Maintain your bicycle. Brake carefully in wet weather or on slippery surfaces. Be careful of dogs and other animals. Know emergency procedures. Parents should ensure that their child has proper safety equipment, that their bicycles are in proper working order, and that their child learns and obeys all traffic laws.






