1. Approve Minutes from July 20th, 2016 Meeting

Harry Wiersgalla made a motion to approve the minutes seconded by Bill Maze Jr. Motion passed unanimously.

2. Citizen Participation- None

3. Club Reports

- Men's Everything is going strong and we have been doing Match Play activity within the club. There's a lot of great competition.
- Women's Nothing new to report.
- Seniors We've hit our high for the last couple of weeks with 56-57 people.

4. Manager of Golf Operations Report-

• **Financial Report-** We have gained some ground and we are up in daily fees by a little over \$10,000. Pass sales went up a little bit once the price dropped. The gap is closing in on cart rentals and we are down from last year by a little under \$10,000. Daily fees were \$33,333.93. Good month for daily fees. Not much in cart rentals. We've had a strong start to July so far and will be running a special today \$20 cart and golf instead of \$25. Daily fees are higher

than shown on the projection report for daily fees. Expenses are still below last year so far. A lot of expenses will come through this month. Handed out calendar for what playdays are coming up next.

- Marketing- We are still running Facebook Ads as well as Golf Now. Golf Now has taken off this year even more than last year.
- Special Projects- There aren't any special projects going on right now however, Mark would like to eventually drain the pond on #14 and mow the area for the ladies tee on #18. Also he would like to re-do all the bunkers and put new sand in them.
- 5. **Director's Report** No report- Suspend until next meeting. Mark stated he was going to talk about the budget and meets tomorrow with the city Manager. No changes will be made to the budget and fees will stay the same. Not a whole lot of change with expenses. On the structural side it's been bumped up to about \$4500 to repair the door to the cart shed and get a new roof for the grill outside. Chris asked if they are allowing anything in the budget for next year's 90th anniversary. Mark stated, he made a request and doesn't see why it wouldn't be approved. Mark is also looking at a couple different things for carts for next year. Hopefully we won't have to go out for bid and can use club car because they have a state contract. If we do go with Club Car we will be looking at getting GPS installed on the carts. We can then track them and program them not to go into certain spots. We may even be able to program the concessions to where you can order straight from the carts.
- 6. Concessionaire report- Dan and Dede- April wasn't that great. Playdays are giving us a boost. Will be getting Carissa back next week and will be as strong as we can be. Things are going good. Haven't got any numbers today but next month there will be some information available.

7. Comments by committee members

Bill Maze Jr. - The course is in great shape. What are the ideas for the 90th next year? Mark will get a list together and give it to the committee next week.

Gary Gard- How much will it cost to fix the bunker on #14? That hole is all about the green. Could be just get rid of it and save the money for something else? How much for the roof over the grill? After buying the flags there will still be about \$1300 left to help pay for it. Can we buy the materials with that money and Men's club completes the repairs?

Ida Lenz- Nothing



Chris Moxley- Nothing


