IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM WISCONSIN DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

The City's Engineering team shared the following information they received from the Wisconsin Department of Transportation regarding **Monday (May 15) night's closure of I-39/90 northbound between Janesville and Edgerton.**

What you need to know:

- Nighttime single lane closures on I-39/90 near the Manogue Road bridge project will start at 8 p.m. for most of the week.
- For the safety of the traveling public and construction crews, I-39/90 northbound will be completely CLOSED to all traffic, between Janesville and Edgerton:
 - **10 p.m. Monday (May 15) to 5 a.m. Tuesday (May 16) – I-39/90 northbound (westbound)** is CLOSED to all traffic between US 14 in Janesville and US 51 near Edgerton. Northbound Interstate traffic will be diverted off I-39/90 at Janesville Exit 171B.
 - ✦ The northbound on-ramps will also be CLOSED from US 14 and WIS 26 in Janesville. Alternate routes are required.
 - ✦ One lane will remain open on I-39/90 southbound.
- During the closure, Interstate traffic will be redirected to the signed detour route of US 14 in Janesville and US 51 through Edgerton.

 - Backups and delays may occur on the detour route depending on traffic volumes.
 - Motorists who typically use I-39/90 during the overnight hours should plan ahead and allow for extra time to reach their destination.
- In conjunction with this overnight demolition, crews will pour concrete for the I-39/90 northbound bridge over the Rock River, near Edgerton and Newville.
 - One lane will be CLOSED on I-39/90 northbound in this area starting at 8 p.m. Monday (May 15) until the northbound Interstate closure at 10 p.m. Monday (May 15).
- All closures, lane restrictions and work operations are weather dependent and subject to change.

2017 CURBSIDE COLLECTION OF YARD WASTE

Yard waste will be collected from May 15 through 18 on your regular trash day. A yard waste sticker will be required on all bags, bundles and/or containers. Yard Waste Stickers can be purchased at Walgreens, ACE Hardware, Public Works Operations Facility, City Hall Treasury, Grinnell Hall, and Leisure Services Office.

- Stickers are sold 5 to a sheet for \$7.50.
- Use only paper yard waste bags, Back-to-Nature Biodegradable bags or clean trash containers 39 gallons or less (no plastic bags).
- Yard waste containers must weigh no more than 60 pounds.
- All brush and shrubbery must be bundled, tied or contained and tagged.
- Place yard waste curbside on your regular trash day during the collection dates.
- Place yard waste a few feet away from your regular trash.

ROCK RIVER TRAIL GRAND OPENING JUNE 3, 2017

The Grand Opening Ceremony for the Rock River Trail will be held in Beloit on June 3, 2017 at the Rotary River Center, 1160 S. Riverside Dr. The free event is scheduled to begin at 10:00 a.m. Please see [attached](#) for more information.

In conjunction with the Rock River Trail celebration, the City has been notified that on Saturday, June 3 a group of bicyclists will be traveling from the Beloit Airport on Stateline Road to the Beloit Rotary River Center on Riverside Drive. It is anticipated that there will be approximately 30-40 bicyclists that plan to leave the Airport about 8:30 a.m. The riders will participate in the festivities and grand opening of The Rock River Trail. We are asking drivers to be alert and aware of the bicyclists. Volunteers will be stationed at key intersections to ensure safe travel. Cyclists will be going at a modest pace, since this is a “ceremonial ride” and not a race.

The subject property is a vacant 2-acre parcel along Prairie Avenue/County Highway G, located immediately north of the YMCA Sports Complex. The applicant has made an accepted offer to purchase the subject property for future retail development. Plan Commission recommendation for approval 7—0.

The intent of the proposed Certified Survey Map is to reconfigure two existing parcels into four new lots in advance of a proposed storage unit and duplex redevelopment project that was previously approved by the City Council. Plan Commission recommendation for approval 7-0.
- c. Application for a Conditional Use Permit to allow an automotive hand wash business, Limited Vehicle Service, in a C-2, Neighborhood Commercial District for property located at 2667 Prairie Avenue. The proposed car wash will provide hand wash services out of two existing bays and will not be automated. The property was previously used as an oil changing service facility, which closed in April, 2016. This item will be referred to Plan Commission for review and recommendation.
- d. Resolution awarding Public Works Contract C17-06, Operations Roof Repair. This project will replace a roof at the Public Works Operations building that is at the end of its useful life and has been experiencing leaks. The low bid was submitted by PHD Roof Doctors, Inc.
- e. Resolution awarding Contract C17-13, Cranston Road Shared Use Path. This project will construct an 8' wide shared-use path on the south side of Cranston Road from Bootmaker Drive to Cobblestone Lane and a 5' sidewalk between Shopiere Road and Bootmaker Drive. Fifteen trees will be removed and two new trees will be planted. The narrow terrace width, existing buried utilities and relocation of overhead utility lines limits the area in the right-of-way to replace the trees. Additional trees will be added to the project if possible, and staff has coordinated with neighboring property owners to try to replace additional trees outside of the right-of-way. The low bid was submitted by Rock Road Companies, Inc.
