### ROAD CONSTRUCTION PROJECT UPDATE - JUNE 7, 2018

#### **Milwaukee Road Project Update:**

- Travel lanes are limited to one lane for each direction; however, the corridor is open and access to businesses remains throughout the project.
- Work related to the new signals continues.
- The storm sewer crossing between Branigan and Freeman/Ford has been completed and travel lanes for each direction are open.

Work scheduled for the upcoming week will include:

- Continued storm sewer pipe work
- Continued work related to the sidewalks
- Continued repairs to the concrete pavement
- Continued work associated with the signals. Some traffic signal poles have been removed in order to pour new signal bases.

#### **Branigan Road Re-Alignment Update:**

- The work on the Branigan Road re-alignment project is scheduled to begin June 11, 2018 and last approximately 30 days. The project will re-align the frontage road between Wal-Mart and Menards. **Any WI business, school or agency** that generates less than 2,200 pounds of hazardous wastes per year may be eligible to use **Clean Sweep for cost of disposal and no vendor mobilization costs.**

**For year-round service, contact Dane County Business Clean Sweep (above).**

**Latex paint or stain** (water-based/water clean-up) – Make solid, remove lids, put with trash. Stir in kitty litter, Oil-Dri, or any highly absorbent material. Fast acting hardeners available at hardware stores (check label for use on stain).

**Latex or oil paint recycling** - Ace Hardware in Janesville, Beloit. Small fee per gallon. Call ahead.  
**Solid chunks of non-lead, non-metallic paints, varnishes** - Remove can lids, place with trash.

**Recycle Year Round!** Many local businesses accept the items below in **LIMITED QUANTITIES** for free or a small fee. **CALL AHEAD.**

**BATTERIES** – Rechargeable, vehicle, and alkaline/‘single use’ can be recycled locally. For safety, tape over contacts. **DO NOT STOCKPILE** batteries due to fire risk. See Recycler List for locations.

**Vehicle batteries:** Auto supply stores. Free.

**USED MOTOR OIL** - Check with city/town waste hauler, auto supply stores. Free. Limit of 1 – 5 gallons depending on site. Call ahead. See Recycler List.

**OIL FILTERS** – Some auto supply stores, check with city waste service. Call ahead.

**Antifreeze/coolant** - Some auto service/supply, check with city. Clean Sweep accepts limited amount. See Recycler List.

**Fluorescent bulbs:** Ace (Beloit, Janesville, Milton, Evansville), Deegans Do-It Best, Batteries Plus, Home Depot, URT, others. Rates and accepted bulb types vary by store. Call ahead.

**Lamp ballasts** – Check label for “PCBs”. URT, Batteries Plus, Alter Recycling (non-PCB only).

**Electronics, computers, printers** – Check with your waste hauler. See Recycler List. For listings by county <https://wisconsin.dnr.shinyapps.io/EcycleCollectorSite/>

**Fire extinguishers:** call local fire safety suppliers.

- **No empty pesticide jugs. See inset this page.**
- No plain fertilizer. Use on plants or place in trash.
- RECYCLING and HOUSEHOLD CHEMICAL DISPOSAL GUIDES at our website or call us.

**Accepted Materials:**

- Herbicides, insecticides, fungicides, and rodenticides, 'weed and feed' fertilizers.
- **DDT; silvex; heptachlor; dieldrin; lindane; toxaphene; and 2,4,5-T**
- Acids and strong bases
- Solvents (acetone, mineral spirits, more)
- **All lead paint (banned in 1978)**
- **All metallic paint**
- **Liquid oil-based paints, varnishes, lacquers, stains (solvent clean up)**
- Photographic chemicals
- Lye
- Pool and spa chemicals
- Wood or paint stripper (methyl chloride, more)
- Wood treatments (penta, creosote, or arsenic)
- Driveway sealers
- **Dairy acids**
- **General farm chemicals**
- Old gasoline, diesel, and oil/gas mixes
- Motor oil, contaminated only
- Hydraulic fluids
- Lighter fluid, charcoal lighter, kerosene

**Clean Sweep cannot accept:**

High pressure cylinders, propane cylinders, Freon gases, infectious and biological wastes, sharps, explosives (detonators, blasting caps, ammunition), radioactive chemicals / devices.

**Unknown Chemicals:** Accepted in quantities less than 50 lbs or 5 gallons. For larger amounts of unknown chemicals, call 754-6617 ext. 4758.

**PESTICIDE CONTAINERS that are empty or almost empty . . .**

1. While still wearing protective equipment, pour any excess pesticide into the sprayer.
2. Fill pesticide container ¼ full of clean water, replace cap and shake container for 30 seconds. Pour rinse water into sprayer.
3. Repeat two additional times, shaking container in different directions.
4. Carefully rinse the outside of the container and the cap over the sprayer (or bucket to catch rinse water).
5. Dispose of the cap as regular household waste, and dispose of or recycle containers according to local regulations.
6. Apply the diluted rinse material according to label directions.

**Buying, Storage, & Safety tips**

- Look at less hazardous alternatives.
- **Read labels before buying** for warnings, storage, shelf-life, disposal, safe for septic systems.
- Buy only what will be used up right away.
- Protect your eyes, lungs, and skin.
- **Storage.** Avoid extreme heat, freezing, damp areas that can rust containers; and long-term storage where products can dry out, evaporate, leak, or spill.
- Do not mix chemicals.
- Never pour hazardous chemicals down the drain.
- Large amounts of waste can be a health, fire, or environmental hazard. Recycle or responsibly dispose of wastes as soon as possible.
- Place fragile packages in separate containers and label "Hazardous!" Use clear bags.
