City of Beloit Combines Polling Places for Spring Primary Election

Jan. 31, 2022 - The City Council has combined polling places for the Spring Primary Election to be held on Feb. 15, 2022, in the City of Beloit. The following polling place locations will be used for the wards indicated:

Voters in wards 1-9, who usually vote at Converse, Gaston, and Hackett Schools, will join voters in wards 10-12 and vote at the **Beloit Historical Society, 845 Hackett Street, Beloit, WI 53511** for this election only.

Voters in wards 13-23, who usually vote at the Beloit Public Library, First Congregational Church, Todd School, River of Life UMC, and Central Christian Church will vote at **Central Christian Church, 2460 Milwaukee Road, Beloit, WI 53511** for this election only.

DUE TO REDISTRICTING, YOUR WARD OR POLLING LOCATION MAY HAVE CHANGED.

The City Council combined polling places due to the low expected voter turn-out for this spring primary election, which includes a primary for School District of Beloit Board of Education.

The deadline to request an absentee ballot by mail is 5 p.m. Friday, February 11. In-person absentee voting begins Tuesday, February 1, at City Hall from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. In-person absentee voting will be on all weekdays except Thursdays through Friday, February 11. After entering City Hall, use the phone in the lobby to call the Clerk/Treasurer's Office and someone will assist you with in-person absentee ballots.

If voting absentee through the mail, your completed absentee ballot must be delivered to the Clerk's Office no later than **8 p.m. on Election Day**. The U.S. Postal Service recommends absentee ballots be mailed one week before Election Day to arrive in time.

All polling places in City of Beloit are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on election day. All polling places are accessible to elderly and disabled voters. Face coverings and social distancing are recommended due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
