Farmer's Market Vouchers

Eligible seniors receive vouchers worth \$35 to purchase locally grown produce at approved farmers' markets and roadside stands.

Who is Eligible? Rock County residents age 60 or older (Native Americans 55 or older)

Monthly household income which is not more than \$2,248 for one person or \$3,041 for two people, etc. Each eligible person may receive vouchers only once in 2023.

<u>How Do I Get These Vouchers</u>? There are a limited number of vouchers available; distributions are on a first come, first served basis.

Vouchers will be available at the Beloit Library on Wednesday, June 14 2:00-3:30pm

If you are unable to get to the distribution site and would like someone else to be pick them up for you please call ADRC Nutrition Program at 608-757-5428.
