### Spring Cemetery Clean-Up

The 2024 spring clean-up of Eastlawn and Oakwood cemeteries is underway. Decorations on gravesites should be removed by Monday, April 15, 2024; new decorations may be placed on or after Wednesday, May 1, 2024.

Please note the following guidelines:

- Broken vases and vases not planted for two years will be removed.
- Artificial and cut flower arrangements must be placed in durable containers; glass, china and fragile vases are not permitted.

- Cemetery staff will dispose of excessive or inappropriate decorations, and any decorations not removed by the deadline of April 15.
- American flags that are not serviceable are removed.
- Ground wreaths and grave blankets are not permitted.

## Spring Yard Waste Curbside Collection - April 8-11 and April 15-18

Yard waste must be set out by 6:00 a.m. on your regular scheduled collection date:

- Brush and shrubbery must be bundled or tied.
- Paper yard waste bags, trash containers 39 gallons or less weighing less than 60 lbs.
- Plastic bags are not permitted.
- Yard waste must be clean and litter free.
- Sticker must be attached to each bundle or container then placed at least 3 feet away from your regular trash.

Stickers are \$10 for a sheet of five. Available for purchase at Department of Public Works, ACE Hardware, Woodman's, City Hall Clerk-Treasurer, and Grinnell Hall.

## Dementia Education and Resources



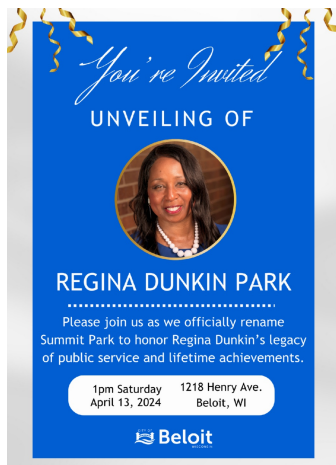
Grinnell Hall Senior Center is partnering with Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC) of Rock County for upcoming presentations centered on dementia.

**Brain Health Presentation; 9-11am Tuesday, April 9.** Participants will gain an understanding of Alzheimer’s disease and related dementia, as well as tangible tools to maintain brain health.

**Dementia LIVE; by appointment Wednesday, April 10.** Dementia LIVE is a dementia simulation experience that immerses participants into life with dementia, resulting in a deeper understanding of what it’s like to live with cognitive impairment and sensory change. Please note individuals with dementia should not be involved with Dementia LIVE. Appointments available at 12:30pm, 1:15pm, 2pm and 2:45pm.

**ADRC Resources; 10am Friday, April 12.** Learn about ADRC’s resources for you or a family member. This program will include a general overview of services that ADRC provides for individuals age 60 and over and adults age 18 and over with physical or developmental disabilities. Topics include housing options, nutrition programs, transportation and more.

## Small Business Grant Opportunity

In partnership with American Express, the Backing Small Businesses grant program supports economically vulnerable and under-resourced small businesses with community reach.
