Work to install the playground at Turtle Island in Riverside Park was scheduled to start this week. It will take several weeks to install the playground; additional work will take place to surface and restore the playground area before it can be opened. We are tentatively planning for a mid-May opening as long as the weather cooperates with the installation.

"SLU," our beloved turtle sculpture, has been



removed temporarily so the artist who created it can add a fresh coat of paint. SLU will return after the playground surfacing is completed.



Spectrum News 1 Adds Segments on Beloit Projects

Spectrum News 1 recently added two great segments on Beloit Projects. Please take a look at some of the exciting things going on!

- <u>Climate Action Plan</u>: One of Beloit's current projects fits under the Climate Action Plan. Recently installed turbo blowers at the city's wastewater treatment center help make sure the micro-organisms at the treatment plant are getting the right amount of dissolved oxygen.
- Royce Elementary School <u>Transformation</u>: Family Services of Southern Wisconsin is transforming the former Royce Elementary School into apartments and a community space for families in need, called Next Steps Family Resilience Center. It will include 18 transitional apartments for unhoused single parents and their children to live in for up to two years as they work to get back on their feet and find permanent housing.

Successful Book Drive at Farmers' Market

The children's book drive was held on March 8th at the Winter Crafter and Famers' Market, hosted by the Downtown Beloit Association. For every book donation received, participants were given a free reusable bag. This initiative aligned with the City of Beloit's commitment to waste reduction and sustainability. We also provided people with information about the locations of Little Free Libraries around Beloit, so they could continue donating books if they



wished. We collected over 350 books from 20 donors, which will be used to restock the Little Free Libraries around Beloit. The libraries are currently being filled this week.

The children's book drive was inspired by discussions with the City of Beloit's Department of Public Works Solid Waste Division and the Downtown Beloit Association. The Solid Waste Division expressed concerns about the recycling process for books, where pages must be torn from their bindings. They wanted to raise awareness about book donation options in Beloit. Little Free Libraries, especially those in the downtown area, are frequently used.

Many thanks to the City Manager's Intern from Beloit College, Kai Herrera, who came up with the idea of hosting a book drive to promote book donations, raise awareness, and help keep educational materials in circulation throughout the city.
