
# **Beloit Report**

Poole, Birch and Beach Watermain Extension Project

Construction for the Watermain extension project will soon be underway.

- Work is planned for April 14 May 16.
- Sixth St. will be closed during the
- project between Maple and Burton. A truck detour will route traffic along Hwy. 51. During construction, access will

be maintained for local traffic.

- Periodic water shutoffs will be needed. The contractor and water department will be working together to give advanced notice to affected residents.
- Residents in the area will need to make sure their trash is on the curb by 6:00 a.m. on collection day to ensure public works can collect prior to the start of the construction day.
- Construction will begin at the south end of the project, and extend north.
- There is a bus route on Sixth St. that may experience interruption.

The City of Beloit Public Works Department is currently accepting requests from residents for terrace trees to be planted this spring. Trees will be planted on a first-come, first-served basis.

The terrace tree species selection will be determined by the city forestry supervisor while taking into account the size of the terrace, presence of utilities and exotic invasive insects. Trees will be planted on a first-come, first-served basis. A limited supply is available. Forestry will accept requests through Thursday, May 1, 2025.

Beloit Public Library's Friends group is hosting its semi-annual used book sale April 10 - 12. Stock up your home library for pennies on the dollar!

The book sale will be held in the Community Room at the Beloit Public Library, 605 Eclipse Boulevard. Thousands of books will be available; cash and credit cards are accepted.

Sale hours will be:

- Thursday, April 10 1-6 p.m.
- Friday, April 11 10 a.m. 4 p.m.
- Saturday, April 12 10 a.m. 4 p.m.

Hardcover books will be priced at \$0.50 each. Paperbacks, media, and all children's books will be \$0.25 each. Saturday is "Bag Day" when a paper grocery bag full of books will cost only \$1.00. Bags will be provided.

Friends at Beloit Library (FABL) is a volunteerrun, non-profit organization that raises funds through the sale of discarded library books and donated books. Sale proceeds help support projects and special programs at the library for both adults and children. For the 2025 fiscal year, FABL has approved a donation of \$23,940.00 to Beloit Public Library.

Monthly Yard Waste Curbside Collection April 14 - 17

Time to start thinking about monthly yard waste collections!

Yard waste must be set out by 6:00 a.m. on your regularly scheduled collection date.

- Brush and shrubbery must be bundled or tied.
- Paper yard waste bags, trash containers 39 gallons or less weighing less than 60 libs.
- Plastic bags are not permitted.
- Yard waste must be clean and litter free.
- Sticker must be attached to each bundle or container then placed at least 3-feet away from your regular trash.

Stickers are \$10 for a sheet of five. Available for purchase at Department of Public Works, ACE Hardware, Woodman's, City Hall Clerk-Treasurer, and Grinnell Hall. If you are unable to purchase yard waste stickers in person, please call 608-364-6663 or 608-364-2929 and purchase with credit/debit card over the phone. Upon completion of purchase, the stickers will be mailed to you.

## Spring Holiday Schedule

On Friday, April 18, the Beloit Transit System will operate on a special holiday schedule:

- The special holiday schedule will have Route 1 and Route 2 beginning service at 7:00am. Both routes will run 30 minute service until the last trip departing from downtown Transfer Center at 4:30pm.
- Route 3 and Route 6 will begin service from the downtown Transfer Center at 7:00am. Both routes will run 60 minute service and the last trip will depart from the downtown Transfer Center at 4:00pm.
- Route 4 will begin service at Beloit Clinic at 7:28am with 30 minutes service and will end service at 4:38pm at Piggly Wiggly.
- Beloit-Janesville Express will run regular service beginning at 6:00am and ending

- service at 6:00pm with a bus leaving for Janesville every 60 minutes..
- There will be no Route 5 service on the holiday schedule.
